

Aquatic Volunteer Program

Aquatic Volunteering is an ongoing after school and weekend program where young teens between the ages of 12 to 15 can earn community service hours as a Jr. Lifeguard and Swim Instructor Aide.

Some of the duties of a Jr. Lifeguard include operating the waterslide and rope swing, helping the Lifeguards enforce rules, and assisting with swim set-ups.

Duties of a Swim Instructor Aide include working alongside our Swim Instructors to assist with skills practice, lesson activities, and teaching water safety to our lesson students.

The City also offers a variety of special events where aquatic volunteers can help out.



On top of community service hours, other perks of the program include school credit, strong friendships, free use of the Recreation Center, and training classes at a reduced rate. As a volunteer, teens will be trained in all they need to know for a future job at the Lynnwood Pool.

Completion of our Training Class is required to become a volunteer. Students in the class will be trained by professional lifeguards in basic water rescues, first aid, and the fundamentals and techniques of swim lesson instruction. Participants will also be educated in the importance of being professional and mature while in a work setting.
